#### B. Notes:

- 1. Water:
  - a) All water mains have been pressure tested, but not chlorinated yet. Once the work is done, they will chlorinate and then turn the water on via the new service lines. There may be a short disruption in service that will be communicated if/when necessary.
  - b) For concerns around fire hydrant placement, contact Evan DiSanto
  - c) Next steps depend on Columbia Gas progress, potentially storm sewer work will be next before water line.
  - d) For those on High St. your water lines will be tied in during a different project because the lines are tied into the back of the homes.
  - e) Lawn damage There will be an extensive closeout process after the streets are paved to assess / restore damage
  - f) Rain gardens there are plans and drawings, there's no concrete around it; plants were chosen in conjunction with OBA; designed to drain out within 48 hrs so should not present a mosquito problem; City will maintain them
- 2. Timeline from here forward:
  - a) Northern half (W Beechwold and north) of the neighborhood has a goal to be completed by end of 2022
  - b) Overall project completion date into spring / summer 2023
- 3. Damage in the right of way that are owner's responsibilities
  - a) Specifically where damage could have been prevented but isn't (i.e. stone walls) - these are noted to be home owners' responsibility if in the right of way
  - b) Contractors should be working to minimize damage
  - Let Bob Simmons or Rick Darr know if you have concerns or questions about damage, response will vary based on the situation
- 4. Curbs and gutters:
  - a) The Historic Commission determined that curbs are not part of the historic landscape

- b) Contractors are going off of plans that were approved; this means some existing curbs remain, some will be removed, and some will be added
- c) Will generally remain uncurbed
- d) Can curbs be put in at the cost of the homeowner?
  - (1) Curb replacement program (reimbursement from the city) is not for installing new curbs
  - (2) Connie Torbek of the Historic Commission states: Any requests for new curbs, where curbing does not exist, should be made to the Department of Public Service, at which time a recommendation would be requested from the Historic Resources Commission. There has been reference to a video shown on PBS about Old Beechwold and historic photos showing streets that include concrete curbing. The specific locations of the photos would need to be identified and documented if utilized for any request for new curbing or gutters where they do not currently exist.
  - (3) Note that any new curbs could impact the new sewer system as well, which could mean more rain gardens or other water management alterations
  - (4) They are installing 200 storm structures (i.e. manhole, grates) to manage rainwater
    - (a) City's responsibility to maintain these structures and keep leaves and debris from covering them up
- e) Roads are going out to original width limits, not necessarily where they are currently; some turning radiuses have been widened; they are minor
  - (1) Advance notice will be provided before paving and roads may not be useable for ~4 hrs
- 5. Big rocks / gravel currently on the roads will be raked from the road surface and be replaced with a more appropriately size aggregate material

- A. Proposed Shared Use Path Updates Jennifer Alexander
  - 1. May 5th CAC will re-vote as to whether or not they support the shared use path; anyone can attend; Jennifer will present on behalf of Old Beechwold. We should try to make a point that if they do re-affirm that we have specifications in mind that we would like to see (size, shape, foliage, etc.)
  - 2. If they do approve the path, we believe (personal opinion) the city will work with us to make the path more palatable to the community
